Key Bible Verses

Philippians 4:6-7 (NLT) - Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.

Matthew 6:9-13 (NLT) - Pray like this: Our Father in heaven, may your name be kept holy. May your Kingdom come soon. May your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us today the food we need, and forgive us our sins, as we have forgiven those who sin against us. And don't let us yield to temptation, but rescue us from the evil one.

Message Summary

This series is about how we overcome anxiety. This week looks at the power of prayer.

Jesus instructs his disciples on prayer and tells them they must not be like the hypocrites (who pray to be seen and heard), or the Gentiles (who assume the volume of their words is a substitute for sincerity and faith). Instead, they are to recognize the one they are praying to as "Father", who knows every need they possess before it is ever articulated.

Prayer is our way of developing a closer relationship to God. To know that he's listening to us as a good dad listens to their child - not because what their kid is saying is necessarily new information; but because they love their kid and want to meet their needs.

Anxiety is very earth-oriented. Praying lifts our perspective above the job that's stressing us out, the money issues we can't stop worrying about, the relationship that seems to be falling apart, our mental or physical health that's being tested... above all that, to heaven! We are reminding ourselves that what we are facing is limited; but the God we are praying to occupies all of space and time. There is a great King, and he is in control of all things! And that is what we need.

As we pray and grow in our relationship, we can ask God to help change this world to be like Heaven, to show us a purpose beyond ourselves, to provide our needs (not necessarily our wants), to give us a clean slate and a new heart, and His power to rescue us from the temptations of the enemy.

Pray for what you need:


A Father who is faithful to you;
